VUK BJELIVUK,VUKAN DAMNJANOVIC,MARKO PARACKI,BALSA DOKNIC Hungarian is a Uralic language spoken in Hungary and parts of several neighbouring countries. It is the official language of Hungary and one of the 24 official languages of the European Union It is also spoken by <u>Hungarian diaspora</u> communities worldwide, especially in North America particularly the <u>United</u> <u>States</u> and <u>Canada</u> and <u>Israel</u>. With 13 million speakers, it is the Uralic family's largest member by number of speakers. The <u>national flag</u> of <u>Hungary</u> (<u>Hungarian</u>: *Magyarország zászlaja*) is a horizontal <u>tricolour</u> of red, white and green (red-white-green). In this exact form, it has been the official flag of Hungary since 23 May 1957. The flag's form originates from national republican movements of the 18th and 19th centuries, while its colours are from the <u>Middle Ages</u>. The current Hungarian tricolour flag is the same as the <u>republican movement flag</u> of the United Kingdom (used since 1816) and the colours in that form were already used at least since the coronation of <u>Leopold II</u> in 1790, predating the first use of the <u>Italian Tricolour</u> in 1797.



Hungary was part of Austria-Hungary until 1918. After that, they separated and founded their own state. Many Hungarians are settled in the territory of Serbia, especially in the north of the Voivodeship
